



Giovanni Di Giuseppe was awarded the Laurea and Ph.D. degrees in 1995 and 2000, respectively, both in physics from the University of Rome “La Sapienza”. In the course of his studies, he was appointed an INFM Young Research Fellow, an INFM Research Fellow, and a Postdoctoral Fellow, in 1995, 1996, and 1999, respectively, all in the Quantum Optics Group of the

From 2009-2010 he was a Visiting Research Scientist at CREOL, the College of Optics and Photonics at the University of Central Florida in Orlando. His research interests span the areas of nonlinear optics, ultrafast optics, quantum-state tomography, and entanglement engineering. He has been working in the areas of quantum information and cryptography, and optomechanics. Dr. Di Giuseppe has contributed extensively to projects supported by the Republic of Italy and the European Union.
